History: Since 1948, we have deep roots!

Service: Pack 65 is the only pack in our area that has adopted two schools for community service projects. We perform 4 service projects at each school during the scouting year.

Work Ethic: Pack 65 has perfected the popcorn sale fundraising opportunity, allowing Scouts to pay for their activities by helping out with the sales. This teaches them to "earn their way". We have been the highest selling Pack in the district for several years and even placed 5th in the nation!

Community: We partner with Troop 65 in the Scouting for Food efforts, and also with Alexander Wilson Elementary for another food drive. The results were thousands of pounds of food being donated to the local food pantry.

Fitness: Scouts pledge to keep themselves "physically strong". Pack 65 has our own Hiking program with our own custom patches! The goal is not only exercise, but to "escape the indoors" and to get our scouts out in nature to learn.

STEM: Pack 65 has a STEM leader who leads the group in optional extra meetings to work on earning special STEM awards. Two of the five STEM Supernova Awards earned in our council last year were from Pack 65!

Camping: Pack 65 camps at least twice during our scouting year. We have some equipment for families who don't, or we can help you choose the right gear for your family. Past camping trips have been at Cedarrock Park, Lake Jordan, Hanging Rock, Fort Fisher, Hyco Lake, NC Zoo and we've even camped on the USS Yorktown aircraft carrier in Charleston, SC!

What does it cost?

It's cheaper than you may think, and you can fully fund it through fundraising! Here's some approximate costs...

Annual Dues - \$75*
Class "B" T-shirt - \$15
Class "A" Uniform - \$60
(Shirt, Patches, Neckerchief & Slide)
Rank Handbook - \$15

To get started you can start with a Class B shirt and your handbook. Uniform pieces can often be found used online, and we also may have some that have been handed down that we can share.

When we do our popcorn fundraiser in the fall, a portion of the profits generated by the Scout are reserved in a "Scout Account" and can be used for supplies at the Scout Shop or to attend Scouting events!

Pack 65 encourages parents to get involved in helping the pack. It's a rewarding way to spend time with your Scout and help the Pack overall. The Pack will cover the cost of training classes offered by our council. For parents serving as a Den Leader or Assistant Den Leader, we will cover the cost of your uniform shirt and patches as a way to thank you for stepping up!
